CHÂTEAU LASSÈGUE: THE OPULENCE

Ornate sundials adorn the façade of Château Lassègue, a beautiful 18th century Château. This symbol of perfect sun exposure is the inspiration for our logo and represents the message of our wines. Lassègue is Saint-Émilion at its most opulent. Old vines grow on the south/southwest hills which are the prolongation of the Côte de Saint-Émilion, and whose soils of clay and limestone add exquisite minerality to their fruit. Rich, aromatic Cabernet Franc married to the dense concentration of old vine Merlot and seasoned with a touch of Cabernet Sauvignon results in a wine that is at once powerful and elegant.

2010 VINTAGE NOTES

An excellent vintage for Lassègue! I cannot help comparing this vintage to the breathtaking 1990 Bordeaux, which came after a beautiful 1988 and a magnificent 1989. The 2010 vintage is even brighter, richer, and more full-bodied than the legendary 2005, with a more subtle minerality. All weather conditions were ideal throughout the 2010 growing season. Harvest took place from September 30 to October 13.

TASTING NOTES

This wine is deep and profound in color, with a beautiful brilliance. The nose reveals very ripe black fruit. In the mouth, power and elegance are intertwined with notes of cassis, black cherry, and blackberry balanced by juniper and clove spice and surrounded by illusive minerality.

The blend brings harmony to a strong structure with good tannins imparted by 15% Cabernet Sauvignon. The spices, complexity and red fruit aromas are the signature of our Cabernet Franc grown in limestone. With notes of black fruit, the Merlot brings a velvety softness over a complex power. This bottle will age nicely for 10 to 20 years.
